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INTRODUCTION

This *Abstract* has been compiled by the Central Statistical Office in collaboration with the Statistics Divisions of Government Departments in order to bring together the main economic and social statistics available for regions of the United Kingdom.

Standard Regions for statistical purposes have been used wherever possible. Some of the other regional classifications diverge from the Standard Regions only to a small extent. Further particulars are given in Appendix I. In certain cases it has been possible to provide figures for conurbations.

This issue also includes an outline map of the New Standard Regions of England and Wales (page 63).

The sources of the statistical data are given in Appendix II, together with the approximate date of publication which will enable users to obtain later figures as they appear and in some cases a greater amount of detail than it is practicable to publish in this *Abstract*.

Definitions of terms occurring in this *Abstract* are given in detail in the *Supplement of Definitions and Explanatory Notes* published annually in conjunction with the January issue of the *Monthly Digest of Statistics*.

Revisions and changes in content

In this issue of the *Regional Abstract* several tables—notably those in Section IX National Health Service and Section X Education—have been reworked and are now shown on the basis of the New Standard Regions.

The following new tables have been added:

Table 5. Numbers of agricultural holdings: by size of holding

Table 44. Survey of personal incomes 1964/65 by ranges of income

Table 45. Average gross annual earnings of persons in civil employment: by age and region of residence

Brief explanatory notes have been included (page 54) which relate to the Inland Revenue Surveys of personal incomes (Tables 43 and 44) and to the new regional analysis of earnings prepared by the Ministry of Social Security (Table 45).

Table 32 in the 1966 edition—Estimated number of public road haulage operators and vehicles at December 1963—has been omitted as it is not proposed to collect any later figures.

Notes on Tables 43-45

Surveys of personal incomes (Tables 43-44)

The allocation to regions is based on the place of main assessment of each person, which is generally the place of business or employment and not the place of residence. H.M. forces, merchant seamen and most civil servants are assessed centrally and are shown as three separate regions.

In these tables, the heading 'Thousands' is the number of persons (counting husband and wife as one person) having total incomes within the range or category concerned. The heading 'Thousands of cases' is the number of persons having income within that class. Thus each person appears once in each class in which he has income, and the total number of cases exceeds the total number of incomes because of persons counted in more than one class.

In the Survey for 1964/65 based on New Standard Regions (Table 43), the numbers shown under Employment income Schedule E are the total numbers of salaries and numbers of wages and therefore exceed the numbers of employment incomes.

Regional statistics of earnings (Table 45)

From the introduction of the graduated pension scheme, information became available in the records of the Ministry of Social Security about the gross earnings of persons of different ages covered by the income tax P.A.Y.E. scheme through which the graduated contributions are collected. The information has now been used to produce a new series of analyses showing the pattern of earnings in the standard statistical regions.

The analyses are based on a sample of the population registered for national insurance, whether paying contributions to the graduated pensions scheme, or not. A 2 per cent. sample of people with contribution cards covering the year to the beginning of March is maintained for general statistical purposes. From this sample, equal to about one-half of 1 per cent of the total number registered for national insurance, the records of employed people aged not less than 18 or more than 69/64 (men/women) were selected. Such people were within the scope of the graduated pensions scheme for the whole of the year, whether participating in it, or contracted out.

These records were scrutinised and sorted to identify two groups of people: (a) those who in that contribution year had actually paid at least 48 contributions as an employed person, and (b) in addition, those others who had paid at least one (but less than 48) such contributions, and had a total of at least 48 paid or credited, usually for sickness or unemployment. The relevant records were then matched against microfilms of the P.A.Y.E. deduction documents to obtain total gross earnings in the tax year ending on 5th April.

The matched records were analysed - separately for men, all women, spinsters, married women, and widows and divorced women - in two ways: group (a) separately (i.e. men whose flat-rate contribution records indicated that they had had virtually a full year's pay), and groups (a) and (b) together (i.e. the records of everyone who had had at least one week's pay in the year, and who had apparently remained in the employment field throughout the year). Both series exclude men and women whose sickness or unemployment had lasted the whole year.

For the purpose of comparing earnings in different regions, each person was allocated to a standard statistical region by reference to his home address. Because this method of allocation would not be satisfactory in relation to forces personnel, regional comparisons were limited to persons in civil employment.

The figures in Table 45 are subject to sampling error, and the extent of this error depends on the numbers in the samples and the dispersion of the amounts received in each area. On this occasion, averages include all levels of earnings covered by the P.A.Y.E. arrangements. The analyses for married women and widows are less representative than those for men and spinsters because many employed married women and widows - especially those working part-time - have low earnings which do not bring them within the scope of the income tax P.A.Y.E. arrangements. For this reason, the table does not show a separate breakdown by region of the figures for married women and widows, but these categories are included in the regional averages for 'All women'.



APPENDIX I

REGIONAL CLASSIFICATION

New Standard Regions

The standard regions for statistical purposes have been revised to coincide with the regions now used for economic planning. The revised definitions are as follows:

North

Cumberland, Durham, Northumberland, Westmorland, and the North Riding of Yorkshire.

Yorkshire and Humberside

The East and West Ridings of Yorkshire (including City of York) and Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey excluding Lincoln C.B.).

East Midlands

Derbyshire (except the High Peak District, which is included in the North West Region), Leicestershire, Lincolnshire (Parts of Holland, Parts of Kesteven and Lincoln C.B.), Northamptonshire, Nottinghamshire and Rutland.

East Anglia

Cambridgeshire and the Isle of Ely, Huntingdonshire, the Soke of Peterborough, Norfolk and Suffolk.

South East

Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire, Essex, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, London (Greater London Council area), Kent, Surrey, Sussex, Hampshire (including the Isle of Wight) and the Borough of Poole.*

South West

Cornwall (including the Isles of Scilly), Devonshire, Dorset (excluding the Borough of Poole)*, Gloucestershire, Somerset and Wiltshire.

Wales

The whole of Wales and Monmouthshire.

West Midlands

Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Worcestershire.

North West

Cheshire, Lancashire and the High Peak District of Derbyshire (the Boroughs of Buxton and Glossop, the urban districts of New Mills and Whaley Bridge, and the rural district of Chapel-en-le-Frith).

Scotland

The whole of Scotland.

Northern Ireland

Antrim, Down, Armagh, Fermanagh, Tyrone, Londonderry.

*Poole is in the South West Economic Planning Region but was previously in the Southern region for statistical purposes and has been left in the new South East statistical region pending the report of the Local Government Commission on this area.

The changes compared with the standard regions as previously defined are:

1. Lincolnshire (parts of Lindsey) has been transferred from the former North Midland Region and added to the East and West Ridings to form the new Yorkshire and Humberside Region.
2. The remainder of the former North Midland Region, less the Soke of Peterborough (which has been joined to Huntingdonshire) has been renamed the East Midlands Region. The County Borough of Lincoln remains in this region.
3. Part of the former Eastern Region—Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire and Huntingdonshire—together with the Soke of Peterborough forms the new Region of East Anglia.
4. The remainder of the Eastern Region, together with the former London and South Eastern and Southern Regions, forms the new South East Region. It should be noted that this Region differs from that covered by the South East Study, which included East Anglia.
5. The remaining Regions have the same definitions and names as before, except that the former Midland Region is now renamed the West Midlands Region.

Apart from the major changes noted above there have been some minor adjustments of county boundaries on the recommendation of the Local Government Commission. Some of these have affected two counties which both form part of the same region and where regional boundaries have been affected the changes have been too small to be of any statistical significance.

Government Departments publishing statistics analysed by region are basing their figures on the revised regional definitions from the earliest convenient date and, wherever possible, adjusting figures for earlier periods. This process of revision is not yet, however, complete and in many of the tables figures for earlier years are on the basis of the old standard regions and only some for the later years on the new basis. The regions used are indicated in the headings to the tables. In the case of statistics provided by the Ministry of Labour the regional figures are built up by aggregating the appropriate local employment exchange areas. The boundaries of such areas, however, do not in all cases agree precisely with county or regional boundaries. A note of the areas affected in this way was given in an article in the *Ministry of Labour Gazette* for February 1966.

The Greater London Council area forms part of the new South East region, but in view of its importance for planning purposes figures for this area are, wherever possible, being made available as well as those for the South East region as a whole. Where statistics are published for conurbations the Greater London Council area will replace the Greater London conurbation with which it largely coincides.

Other Regional classifications

Ministry of Agriculture Regions

The composition of the Ministry's eight regions in England and Wales was described in *Farm Classification in England and Wales 1964-65*. The only three regions which coincide exactly with the New Standard Regions are Northern (North), South Western (South West) and Wales.

National Coal Board Divisions

Ministry of Power Regions

Electricity Board Areas

Gas Board Areas

Maps defining these special areas can be found in the *Ministry of Power Statistical Digest*.

British Iron and Steel Federation Districts

These areas are defined in *Annual Statistics* published jointly by the Iron and Steel Board and the British Iron and Steel Federation.

Conurbations

These areas are as defined in the *Annual Abstract of Statistics*, Appendix I.
