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## INFORMATION NOTICE

### The future of Monthly Digest of Statistics

27 July 2010

The September 2010 edition of the *Monthly Digest of Statistics* will be the last to be released as a print publication under the existing arrangements with Palgrave Macmillan.

From October 2010 *Monthly Digest* will be published by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) as an enhanced, web-based publication.

This step follows a recent review of ONS's publishing strategy, where customer feedback supported enhancement of publication releases online enabling wider circulation and greater flexibility of usage.

Palgrave Macmillan will continue to publish current ONS print titles under their own imprint for customers who require printed versions (for further details go to [www.palgrave.com/ons](http://www.palgrave.com/ons)).

A number of improvements will be introduced to the online version of *Monthly Digest* from October.

The publication will adopt a revised structure and the tables will provide a greater focus on monthly and quarterly data. Each table in the existing publication has been reviewed and a number of tables and chapters will be streamlined to avoid potential duplication with other ONS data releases. For example, Labour Market statistics are already available at the Labour Market section of the ONS website, so the *Monthly Digest* pages will give links there rather than replicate the tables.

The online publication will be spreadsheet based, allowing users greater flexibility to access and process the data. It will also include additional commentary on statistical series, such as notes about methodological changes that have been introduced or are planned.

# Introduction

This publication has been prepared by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) in collaboration with a number of government departments and other organisations. The assistance provided by them is gratefully acknowledged.

The name of the department or organisation providing the statistics is shown under each table, additionally, on some tables this is followed by a contact telephone number.

All the data series published in the *Monthly Digest* are contained on an ONS database, and nearly all are stored with a four letter identification code (e.g. ABMZ). These codes appear at the start of columns or rows so that they can be quoted if you contact us requiring any further information.

The latest Annual Supplement to *Monthly Digest* was published in the January 2010 edition. This gives detailed definitions and explanatory notes and includes an index of sources.

## Definitions and classifications

The following general definitions should be noted in using the *Digest*:

**Area covered.** Except where otherwise stated, all statistics relate to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

**Seasonality.** Except where otherwise stated, all statistics are not adjusted to take account of seasonal factors.

The UK Standard Industrial Classification 1992 is used in a number of tables in this digest to split economic activity. Full details are available from *UK Standard Industrial Classification of Economic Activities 1992*, and *Indexes to the UK Standard Industrial Classification of Economic Activities 1992*, both available from Palgrave Macmillan.

Regional classification is based on the Government Office Regions.

## Symbols and conventions used

**Change of basis.** Where consecutive figures have been compiled on different bases and are not strictly comparable, a footnote is added indicating the nature of the difference. Also, a line may be drawn across a column between two consecutive figures indicating that the figures above and below the line have been compiled on different bases.

**Units of measurement.** The various units of measurement used in this digest are listed on the opposite page.

**Symbols.** The following symbols have been used throughout:

.. = not available (also information suppressed to avoid disclosure)

- = nil or less than half the final digit shown

† = indicates that the data have been revised

p = provisional data

since the last edition: the period marked is the earliest in the table to have been revised

Also, some tables have symbols specific to them. These will be explained in the footnotes to those tables.

**Rounding of figures.** In tables where figures have been rounded to the nearest final digit, there may be a slight discrepancy between the sum of the constituent items and the total as shown.

## Provisional data

Some figures are provisional and may be subject to revision in later editions. This applies particularly to data for the most recent time periods. Where data has been revised a dagger symbol, as previously mentioned, will appear.

Mean temperatures were well above the the 1971-2000 normal, typically by between 1.5 and 2.5 deg C over England and Wales and between 0.5 and 1.5 deg C over Scotland and Northern Ireland. For the UK, November was the warmest since 2003 and ranks seventh in a series starting in 1914. There were very few days with air frost. Almost all areas recorded well above average rainfall, with many having well over twice the normal amount. The wettest areas were Cumbria, Northumberland, the Scottish Borders and parts of N. Ireland, mid-Wales and southern England.

It was the wettest November over the UK in a series from 1914. Many areas received close-to-average sunshine. It was dullest in Wales, the Scottish Borders and parts of western and southern England, the brightest in northern Scotland and much of eastern England.

1 District values for each element are computed using all available climate stations, excluding rooftop sites for minimum air temperature. The values in the table may not be compatible with other time series (eg. Central England Temperature, England and Wales Rainfall).
