INLAND REVENUE

INCOME TAX

It is proposed to reduce the standard rate of income tax by 6d., from 9s. to 8s. 6d., and to reduce each of the reduced rates by 3d., i.e., from 7s., 5s. and 2s. 6d. to 6s. 9d., 4s. 9d. and 2s. 3d. respectively.

It is proposed to increase the single allowance from £120 to £140, the married allowance from £210 to £240 and the child allowance from £85 to £100 and to reduce the band of taxable income charged at the lowest reduced rate from £100 to £60.

It is proposed to increase the income limit for small income relief (whereby relief from tax is given on two-ninths of total income instead of on two-ninths of earned income only) from £250 to £300.

It is proposed to increase the income limits for the dependent relative allowance so that the full allowance will be given where the relative's income does not exceed £105, the allowance thereafter being reduced by £1 for each £ by which the relative's income exceeds that figure.

It is proposed to remove the special emoluments limit of £52 which at present applies to child allowance in respect of a child undergoing training for a trade, profession or occupation, so that child allowance may be claimed in such cases provided the child's income does not exceed £85 a year.

SURTAX

It is proposed that the rates of surtax for 1954-55, payable on 1st January, 1956, and for 1955-56, payable on 1st January, 1957, shall be the same as those for 1953-54.

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

EXCISE

Purchase Tax.—It is proposed to reduce to 25 per cent. the rate of tax on tissues and fabrics, on domestic textile articles and on domestic soft furnishings of the kinds at present chargeable at the rate of 50 per cent. under Groups 5 and 6 of the Purchase Tax Schedule, other than tissues and fabrics of woollen material and articles made wholly or mainly of woollen material. Woollen material means textile material containing more than 15 per cent. by weight of fibre (whether or not subjected to any process of manufacture or recovery) from the coat or fleece of alpaca, camel, goat, hare, lamb, llama, rabbit, sheep, vicuna or yak, or of horsehair.

It is also proposed to reduce from 50 per cent. to 25 per cent. the rate of tax chargeable on plastic sheeting under Group 7 of the Schedule.

These changes apply to goods delivered by registered manufacturers and whole-salers, or imported by unregistered persons, after 19th April, 1955.
