## GENERAL INTRODUCTORY NOTES

1. Scope of Accounts-The Annual Statement of the Trade of the United Kingdom for 1963 . is issued in five volumes. Volume I contains summaries of the import and export trade; Volume II gives detailed statements respecting articles imported and re-exported, and of imports and exports of gold and coin; Volume III gives similar details of exports of the produce and manufactures of the United Kingdom; Volume IV gives details of the trade with individual countries; and Volume V gives particulars of the trade at the ports of the United Kingdom.

For full particulars of the contents of each Volume see the Schedule to this introduction.
Official accounts are maintained under each description of goods separately distinguished in the official "Statistical Classification for Imported Goods and for Re-exported Goods" and the "Export List". The order and grouping of the headings in these Lists have been revised for 1963 in accordance with the Standard International Trade Classification, Revisod, of the United Nations (S.I.T.C., Revised), which provides headings corresponding to those of the Brussels Tariff Nomenclature.

Less detailed particulars respecting trade are published monthly in the Overseas Trade Accounts of the United Kingdom. Information in amplification of those Accounts and in advance of these annual publications can be obtained (when circumstances allow) from the Controller, Statistical Office, Customs and Excise, Portcullis House, 27 Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea, Essex, on payment of a fee to cover the cost of preparing the information.

Throughout these Volumes the term United Kingdom comprises Great Britain, Northern Ireland and the Isle of Man. Trade between the United Kingdom and the Channel Islands is regarded for statistical purposes as internal trade and has been excluded from the statistics. Conversely, for statistical purposes, direct trade between the Channel Islands and overseas countries other than the United Kingdom is treated as United Kingdom external trade.
2. Exclusions:- (a) The following classes of merchandise arriving in this country are not included in the import statistics:-
(i) Personal and household effects; parcels brought by passengers for private use.
(ii) Fish, whales and other natural produce of the sea taken by ships registered in the United Kingdom and brought direct to the United Kingdom.
(iii) Stores for the naval, military and air forces carried on British Government vessels.
(iv.) Equipment for the naval, military and air forces imported from the United States under the Mutual Defence Assistance agreement.
(v) Stores and equipment for the use of Commonwealth and foreign Government forces (including American Post Exchange stores).
(vi) Certain atomic energy materials when imported by the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority or its agents, including uranium ore and concentrates.
(vii) Goods directly imported by Ambassadors and Ministers accredited to the United Kingdom.
(viii) Articles imported solely for temporary exhibition in galleries or museums in the United Kingdom, and articles returned to the United Kingdom after temporary exhibition in galleries or museums abroad.
(ix) Imports and re-exports of unset precious and semi-precious stones and pearls (including diamond powder and diamond grit but excluding unmounted diamonds drilled so as to be adapted for use in wire-drawing dies).
(x) Ballast of no commercial value.
(b) The following classes of merchandise departing from this country are not included in the export statistics:-
(i) Personal and household effects; parcels taken by passengers for private use.
(ii) Stores taken on board vessels (including fishing vessels) or aircraft engaged in the foreign trade for their own use, and ballast of no commercial value (see also paragraph 12 (a) regarding bunker fuel).
(iii) British Government owned stores exported for British Government use abroad.
(iv) Used clothing and household goods exported by charitable organisations.
(v) Army, Navy and Air Force stores and equipment imported by Commonwealth or foreign Government authorities in the United Kingdom and subsequently re-exported by them direct or through overseas Government agencies in the United Kingdom.

Articles exported solely for temporary exhibition in galleries or museums abroad, and articles re-exported after temporary exhibition in galleries or museums in the United Kingdom.
(c) The following classes of aircraft arriving in or departing from this country are not included in the import and export statistics:-
(i) Aircraft of the Royal Air Force and of the Royal Navy.
(ii) Aircraft for the use of Commonwealth and foreign Government forces in this country.
(iii) Commercial aircraft employed on regular international air services, provided that they are merely passing to and fro between this country and abroad.
(iv) Commercial aircraft on charter and touring aircraft for which only a temporary stay in this country or abroad is intended.
(v) Aircraft imported temporarily for repair or modification and subsequent re-export.
(vi) Aircraft, other than newly constructed, for delivery to a consignee outside the United Kingdom or arriving in this country on purchase from abroad.
(d) The following classes of ships and boats arriving in or departing from this country are not included in the import and export statistics:-
(i) H.M. ships and ships of Commonwealth and foreign Governments; war vessels transferred to the United Kingdom from Commonwealth or foreign Government ownership, or vice versa. (Newly built war vessels for overseas Governments are, however, included in the export statistics.)
(ii)

Ships arriving or departing under their own power or in tow, as actual or prospective carriers of goods or passengers by sea, including ocean-going tugs and fishing vessels. (Newly built ships departing for the first time to a place, and for the purpose of delivery to a consignee, outside the United Kingdom, or arriving in this country on purchase from abroad are, however, included in the statistics.)
(iii)

Ships and boats arriving for and departing after a temporary stay in this country, or departing for and returning from a temporary stay abroad.
3. Inclusions-Exports of relief and rehabilitation supplies, other than those noted at 2 (b) (iv) above, are included in the export figures, as also are stores shipped abroad for the Navy, Army and Air Force Institutes, the Y.M.C.A., and other similar organisations.
4. Gold and Coin-Particulars of imports and exports of gold and monetary items as defined by the International Monetary Fund are excluded from all general tables, but are given in special tables in Volumes I and II. (Notes of legal tender in the United Kingdom are excluded throughout.) There were no transhipments of gold and coin recorded during the year 1963.
5. Parcel Post-Imports by parcel post values at over $£ 50$ and charged with duty are included, according to their descriptions, with other goods imported. In general, all other imports and exports by parcel post are shown as such in Section 9 and, consequently, the figures for the descriptions of goods throughout these accounts are deficient to the extent of the volume of this parcel post trade which, in some cases, is known to be considerable. Exports of imported merchandise by parcel post are included with the exports of the produce and manufactures of the United Kingdom.

The figures of imports and exports under the heading "Post Parcels not classified according to kind" relate to goods sent through the G.P.O. as "parcel post"; they do not include packets sent by "letter post" or by "printed paper post". The limit of weight for parcel post is 22 lb ., except where the receiving country's regulations stipulate a lower weight limit, e.g. South-West Africa Territory, where the limit is 11 lb .
6. Quantities and Values of Imports and Exports-Quantities and values are based on the declarations of importers and exporters, or their agents, which may be verified by Customs officials.

Quantities are not recorded in respect of all goods, but where goods are required to be entered by weight the quantities given represent the net weight of the goods exclusive of containers, internal wrapping or any other packing, except that all air transhipments are entered by gross weight.

The value of the imports represents the value as defined in the Sixth Schedule to the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 (and applied by Section 258 of that Act) at the time when the goods are entered. Briefly stated, this value is the price which the goods would fetch at that time, on a sale in the open
market between buyer and seller independent of each other, with delivery to the buyer at the port or place of importation, the seller bearing freight, insurance, commission and all other costs, charges and expenses incidental to the sale and delivery of the goods with the exception of any duty or tax chargeable in the United Kingdom. Normally, for goods imported under a contract of sale negotiated in fully open market conditions the value is represented by the price made under that contract, adjusted as necessary to take account of costs, charges and expenses as above. Where an amount in foreign currency has had to be converted to its sterling equivalent the rate of exchange used has been that appropriate at the time of lodgment of the Customs entry.

The value of the exports represents the cost of the goods to the purchaser abroad, including packing, inland and coastal transport in the United Kingdom, dock dues, loading charges, and all other costs, profits, charges and expenses (e.g. insurance and commission) accruing up to the point where the goods are deposited on board the exporting vessel or aircraft or at the land boundary of Northern Ireland, and is known as the "free on board" value; this value does not include purchase tax.
7. Transit Trade-Goods entered for transhipment, whether dutiable or free, either for removal from a vessel in one port and conveyance to another port for re-shipment abroad, or removed under the same conditions from one vessel to another in the same port, are not included in the general tables of imports and exports of imported merchandise but particulars are shown in special tables (see Schedule to Introduction). Goods transhipped under bond are to be distinguished from goods which are entered for storage in bonded warehouses and are afterwards exported therefrom, these goods being included in the general tables of imports and exports of imported merchandise.
8. Countries to which Imports and Exports are credited-Imports are classified as received from the country of consignment; that is, the country from which the goods were originally despatched to the United Kingdom, with or without breaking bulk in the course of transport, but without any commercial transaction in any intermediate country. The country of consignment is not necessarily the country of shipment, origin or manufacture. Exports are classified as despatched to the country of consignment; that is, the last country to which the goods are consigned, with or without breaking bulk in the course of transport, but without any commercial transaction in any intermediate country. The country of consignment is therefore not necessarily the country of unshipment or ultimate destination. Exports of newly built sea-going ships are normally classified as despatched to the country of registration.

Goods consigned direct to the United Kingdom from fishing vessels other than those of United Kingdom registration are classified as received from the country in which the vessel is registered.
9. Arrangement of Countries-The countries are arranged in two parts namely:- (a) Commonwealth countries (this term is used to include colonies, protectorates, protected states, trust territories and the territory under condominium) and (b) foreign countries.

Shortened forms of certain full country titles in the "Statistical Classification" and "Export List" have been used in Volumes II and III.

In addition to the above changes of designation, Kuwait has been transferred from the Commonwealth Countries section of the list to the Foreign Countries section.
10.Revenue Statistics-Figures of Customs and Excise Revenue are published annually in the Report of the Commissioners of H.M. Customs and Excise and in greater detail in a separate publication under the title of "Protective Duties: Values or quantities of imported goods entered for home use in the United Kingdom and receipts of duty".
11.Bonded Warehouse Account-Details of the quantities of certain articles of food, beverages and tobacco delivered free of duty from bonded warehouses for the use of H.M. Forces and for use as stores on ships and aircraft are given in Volume IV (see Schedule to Introduction).

## 12.Miscellaneous:-

(a) Bunker Fuel (coal, coke, manufactured fuel and oil fuel) shipped in the United Kingdom for use on board steamers, \&c., clearing for foreign trade (including fishing vessels) and for the use of foreign-going aircraft, is not an "export" in the ordinarily accepted meaning of the term and is, accordingly, excluded from the general tables.
(b) Exports of Imported Merchandise comprise goods, materials and articles exported in the condition in which they were imported, or after having undergone repair or minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged, e.g. simple blending, cleaning, drying, sorting, husking or shelling, repacking, bottling, \&c. Goods finished or wholly or partly manufactured in the United Kingdom from imported raw materials, and goods completed or further advanced towards completion in the United Kingdom after being imported partly manufactured (except goods which have undergone only repair or minor operations and are essentially unchanged) are, on exportation, included in the tables of exports of the produce and manufactures of the United Kingdom.

Re-exports of horses and greyhounds are included in the figures of exports owing to the difficulty of separate classification.

## SPECIAL INTRODUCTORY NOTES TO VOLUME I

(a) Merchandise Retained in the United Kingdom-The retained figures given in Tables 9, 10 and 11 represent the balances between Imports and Exports of imported merchandise as registered in each year. The figures shown may only approximately represent the actual quantities and values of the goods retained out of the imports of each year for the following reasons, viz.:-
(i) Goods registered as exported in any year were not necessarily imported in that year.
(ii) There is reason to doubt whether reliable information as to the country from which the goods were declared as consigned on importation into the United Kingdom is in all cases available to exporters.
(iii) Imported goods which are subsequently exported will normally have a value on exportation higher than that declared on importation.
(b) Weight Conversion Factors-Under the terms of the International Convention relating to Economic Statistics drawn up by the League of Nations in 1928 and adopted in an amended form by the United Nations under a Protocol signed in December, 1948, adhering countries are required to publish in their Annual Trade Returns an estimate of the average weight of each item which is recorded by a unit of measure other than weight. In accordance with this requirement a table of weight conversion factors has been furnished by the Board of Trade and is printed on the following pages. These factors, which have been calculated by the Board of Trade from such information as was available, cover a number of the items recorded in these Trade Returns by a unit of measure other than weight. It has not been found practicable to calculate conversion factors for every item, but it is hoped to add to the list as opportunity offers. The Board of Trade wish it to be understood that whilst every care has been exercised in compiling the statement the figures given in the table are only estimates, applicable to aggregate imports or exports, and not necessarily to trade with individual countries, and that they are subject to revision in the light of fuller information which may become available. The same factors are suggested for imports and exports unless separate factors are given.
