Insolvencies in the First Quarter 1994

Numbers of company insolvencies and personal insolvencies, seasonally adjusted, for England and Wales were published on 6 May through the Association of British Chambers of Commerce. An unadjusted breakdown into broad industrial sectors to Q4 1993 is included, as is also a summary of Scottish insolvency figures to date.

Notes explaining insolvency terms such as voluntary liquidation, sequestration and bankruptcy are also available on request.

Company insolvencies in England and Wales in the first quarter of 1994 totalled 4,513 on a seasonally adjusted basis, representing a 3% fall on the previous quarter and a 21.6% fall on the same period a year ago. This represents 2.2% of the number of active companies (1.8% of the total number of registered companies).
