Most forecasters underestimated the strength of demand in the late 1980s and also the severity of the subsequent recession. This report arises from a project set up at the Institute to reassess the usefulness of economic forecasts in the light of this experience, and to consider what lessons might be drawn from it. The long record of forecasting at the Institute and the Treasury is used to compare experience during the latest cycle with that of earlier decades. For example, why was the recession of 1980 anticipated the previous year, whilst the recession of 1991 was not? A variety of statistical tests are reported to establish the degree of structural change in the economy. Since the main errors of recent forecasts resulted from failing to pick up signals of approaching turbulence, the report also identified some leading indicator variables which have contained especially valuable information in advance of recent turning points in the economy.

● **EDUCATIONAL PROVISION, EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT AND THE NEEDS OF INDUSTRY: A REVIEW OF RESEARCH FOR GERMANY, FRANCE, JAPAN, THE USA AND BRITAIN**

Andy Green and Hilary Steedman

Many studies at the National Institute have identified differences in education and training as reasons for differences in labour productivity between Britain and other industrial countries.

This Report was prepared as a convenient source of reference, summarising these international contrasts. The first section lists the main characteristics of education and

training provision in five countries, and points to a more detailed account of each provided in five appendices. Section 2 compares the levels of attainment by 16-18 year olds in the same countries, as they are now and how they have changed over time. The long 'tail' of low achievers in Britain is identified as a particularly worrying find. 'Despite being relatively successful in producing a highly qualified elite, Britain is under-performing in the education of the majority of its young people'. Section 3 considers the reasons for lower attainment standards drawing on a wide range of published studies. ● **HIGH-LEVEL SKILLS AND INDUSTRIAL COMPETITIVENESS: POST-GRADUATE ENGINEERS AND SCIENTISTS IN BRITAIN AND GERMANY**

This study seeks to investigate the contribution made by post-graduate engineers and scientists to industrial competitiveness by means of a detailed comparison of matched samples of production and research establishments in the British and German chemicals and engineering industries. The report warns that failure by British enterprises to match foreign rivals in R&D spending and in associated employment of highly-qualified technical staff could cost them dearly in product markets where manufacturers are increasingly obliged by their customers to achieve higher quality and performance standards while simultaneously having to compete on price as well. In these circumstances even firms that aspire to do no more than adopt innovations developed elsewhere now increasingly needs access to the services of highly-qualified engineering and scientists - either as full-time employees or as external specialists employed on a contract basis - in order to be able to identify and make use of all relevant information generated by

their competitors and in the external science base (universities, research institutes, consultancies, etc).

Trade and Industry

Insolvencies in the First Quarter 1994

Numbers of company insolvencies and personal insolvencies, seasonally adjusted, for England and Wales were published on 6 May through the Association of British Chambers of Commerce. An unadjusted breakdown into broad industrial sectors to Q4 1993 is included, as is also a summary of Scottish insolvency figures to date.

Notes explaining insolvency terms such as voluntary liquidation, sequestration and bankruptcy are also available on request.

Company insolvencies in England and Wales in the first quarter of 1994 totalled 4,513 on a seasonally adjusted basis, representing a 3% fall on the previous quarter and a 21.6% fall on the same period a year ago. This represents 2.2% of the number of active companies (1.8% of the total number of registered companies).

Individual insolvencies in England and Wales in the first quarter of 1994 totalled 8,096 on a seasonally adjusted basis, representing a decrease of 6% on the previous quarter and of 20.2% on the same period a year ago.

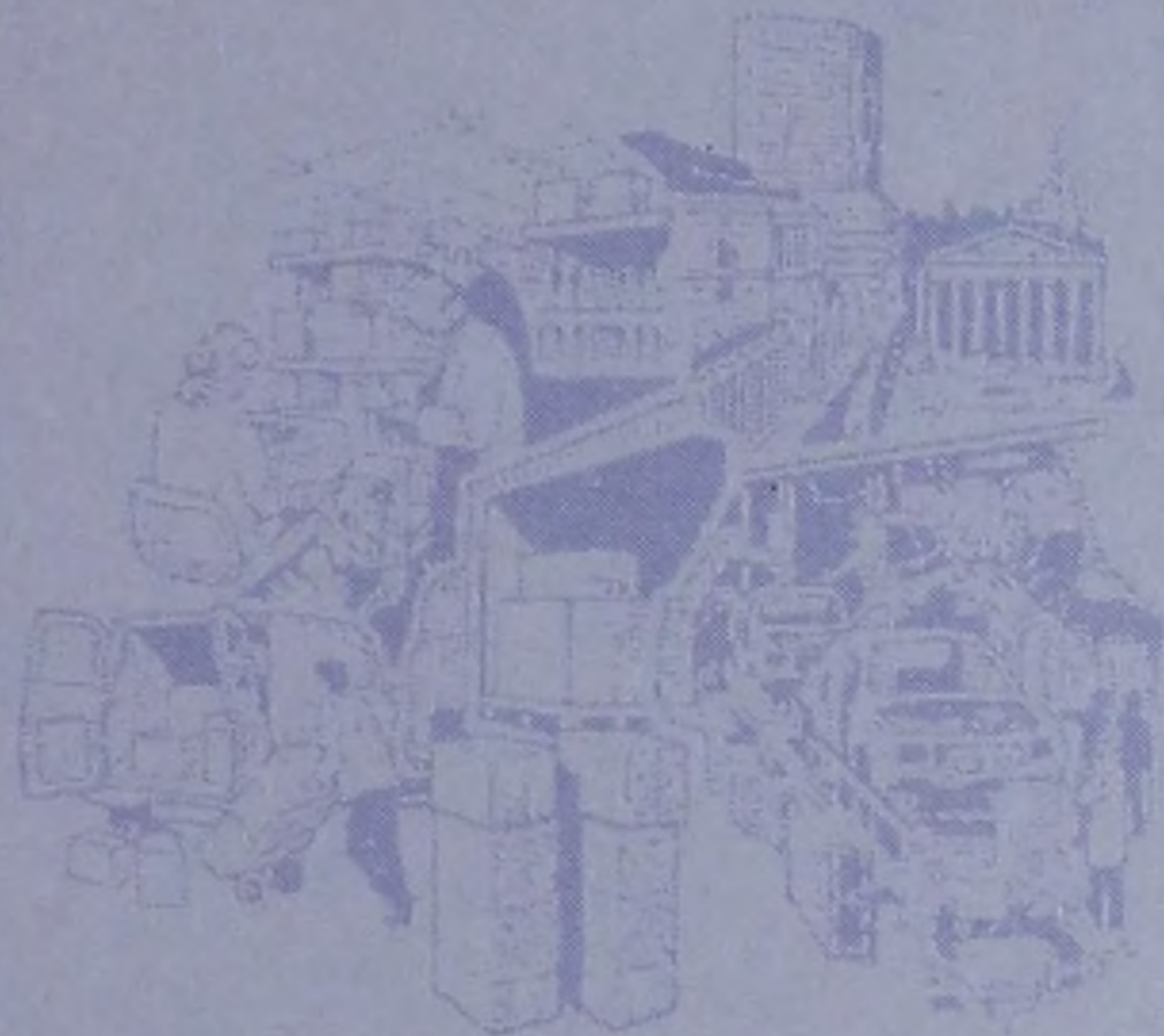

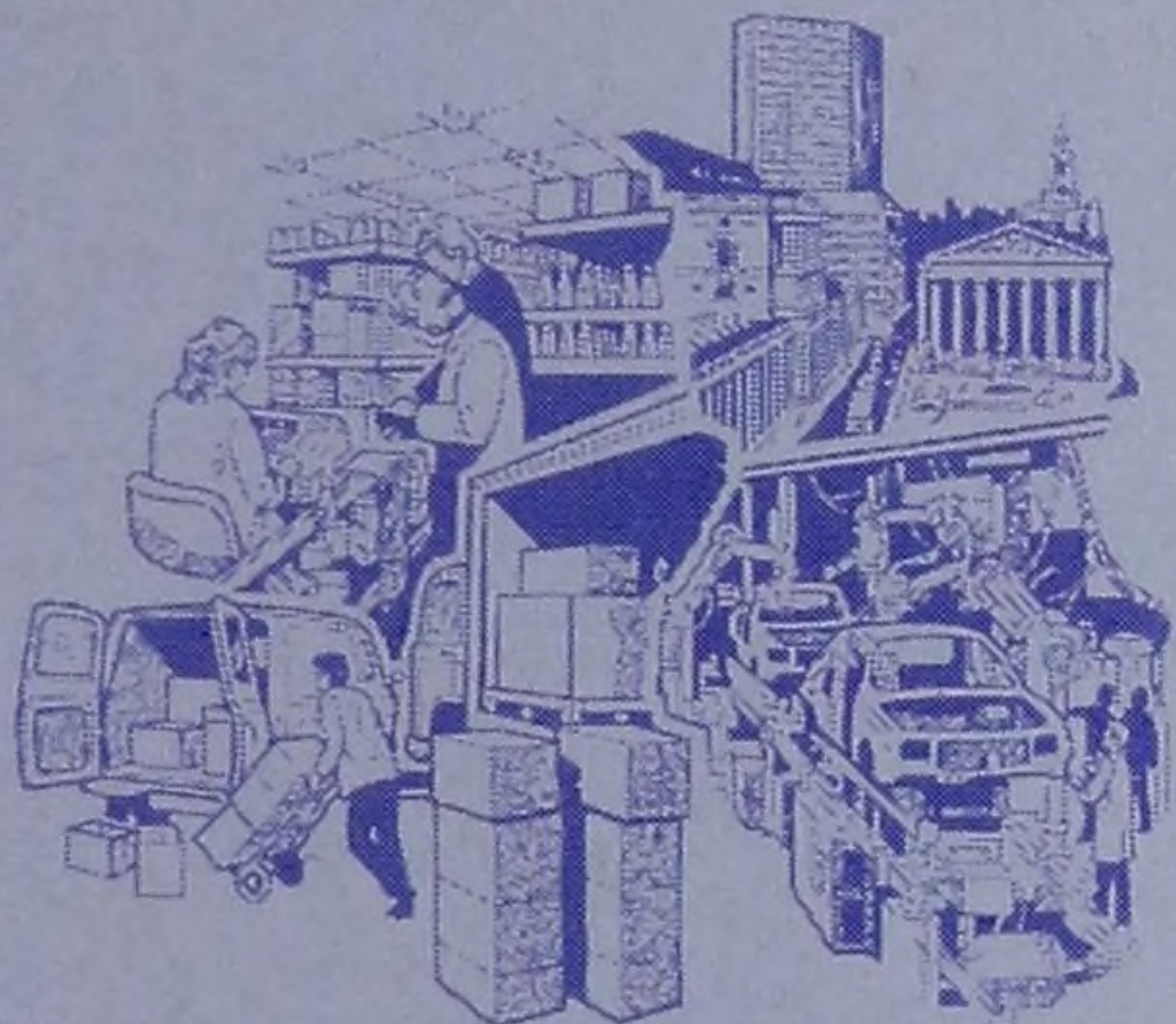

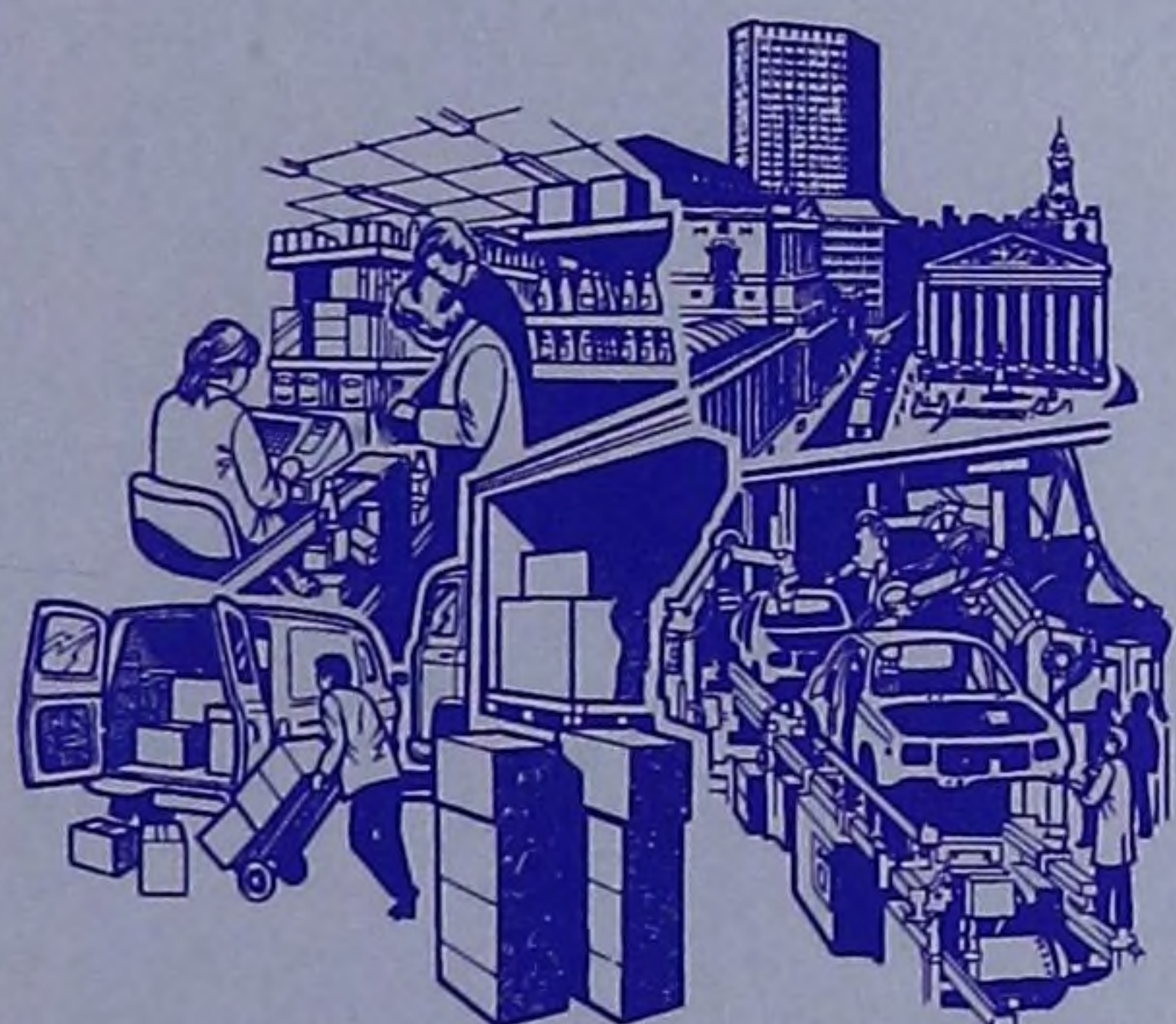
