

Farm Incomes in the United Kingdom 1993/94

Farm Incomes in the United Kingdom, published on the 23 March 1995, provides detailed information on the structure of the United Kingdom agricultural industry.

The tenth volume, in an annual series, gives detailed analyses of the developments in the income, assets and liabilities of the agricultural industry at the farm level and in aggregate. Detailed economic results, based on the Farm Business Survey (Farm Accounts Scheme in Scotland) are shown by country, farm type, business size and tenure as well as estimates of the gross margins for a range of crop and livestock enterprises in England and Wales. In most tables the years covered are 1993 and 1994.

For the first time a special study of farmer's capital investment was carried out on the same sample of farms for the Farm Business Survey for the years 1990/91-1992/93. The details are summarised in the report and the objective of the Capital Investment Survey was to provide more detailed information about the level and pattern of investment in Agriculture at farm level for England and Wales.

Statistical Bulletin 6/95

This bulletin shows summary statistics derived from the information about GCSE and GCE A/AS level examination entries and results for each candidate, which was collected for the preparation of the 1994 School and College Performance Tables. It also provides further information on examination entries and results by gender, type of establishment, and subject.

Environment

Land Use Change in England No 10

The latest edition of this series of Statistical Bulletins will be published by the Department of the Environment in May 1995. The Bulletin presents the Department's statistics on changes in land use in England which took place in 1990. Details of changes in land use are recorded for the Department by Ordnance Survey (OS) as part of its map revision work.

The statistics relate to both the new use and previous use of land, and the gross and net changes between uses. Results are presented for ten land use groups, of which the vacant land group has been disaggregated to provide separate figures for previously developed and previously undeveloped vacant land. The land use groups can be divided broadly into "rural" and "urban" uses. Definitions of the land use categories are given in the Bulletin.

To examine changes to urban uses in a particular year, five years of data collection are necessary to provide reliable results. Hence the most recent year for which results can be presented is 1990, based on information

collected between 1990 and 1994. Changes to residential use are recorded more quickly, and the bulletin presents preliminary results for changes which occurred in 1991 and 1992, based on information collected between 1991 and 1994.

The Statistics are best suited to analyses of changes to urban uses, particularly to residential uses, and of the recycling of urban land.

Persons Granted British Citizenship, 1994

The annual Home Office Statistical Bulletin on citizenship statistics was published on 25 may 1995. It contains information on grants of British citizenship in the United Kingdomanalysed by basis (residence, marriage, etc) and type (discretionary or entitlement) and by previous nationality, for 1994 and earlier years. 44,000 persons were granted British citizenship in the United Kingdom in 1994, citizens of New Commonwealth countries accounting for some 55 per cent of this total.

Control of Immigration: Statistics UK Third and Fourth Quarters and Year 1994

The regular six monthly Home Office Statistical Bulletin on the control of immigration was published on 12 May 1995. This contains summary information on acceptances for settlement in the United Kingdom; entry clearance applications in the Indian sub-continent; admissions to the UK and extensions of stay in selected categories; asylum; and enforcement action.

55,100 persons were accepted for settlement in the UK in 1994. This was 600 fewer than in 1993 but still 9,000 more than the low of 1987. The decrease included a fall of 900 is spouses partly offset by a rise of 700 in work permit holder acceptances. 5,000 persons left the UK as a result of enforcement action in 1994, compared with 6,100 in 1993 and 2,700 in 1987.

Applications for asylum made in country or at ports totalled 32,800 (excluding dependants) in 1994. This was over 10,000 more than in 1993 and more than 8 times the level in 1988. Nearly 21,000 decisions were made in 1994, 2,400 less than in 1993 but still substantially higher than 1991 and earlier years. 825 decisions were to recognise the applicant as a refugee and grants asylum, 3,700 were not to recognise but grant exceptional leave to remain and 16,500 were to refuse.

Criminal careers of those born between 1953 and 1973

A bulletin giving information on the criminal careers of people born between 1953 and 1973 was published in July. It is based on analysis of the Offenders Index, a database containing the criminal histories of all those convicted of a 'standard list' offence (mainly those that were, or could have been tried at the Crown Court) in England and Wales since 1963. The bulletin provides estimates of the proportion of the general population with a conviction, for example 34 per cent of males born in 1953 had been convicted before the age of forty. The bulletin also includes estimates of the frequency of offending by the convicted population, of the proportion of offenders desisting from crime, of the proportion of the population criminally active of the proportion of the population with a custodial conviction and of the probability of an offender having further court appearances given a certain number of previous court appearances.

Criminal statistics England and Wales 1993

This annual reference volume includes information on recorded crime, the use of firearms, homicides, court proceedings and sentencing as well as the use of remand. Additions to the 1993 volume are the inclusion of a section on international comparisons in chapter 1 and the introduction of a ninth chapter giving an analysis from the Offenders Index of the criminal histories of those convicted in 1991 and an update of previous work on criminal and custodial careers. Time series, generally for 1983 to 1993 are provided together with more detailed data for the latest year. There is a list of key points at the start of each chapter. This publication is accompanied by four volumes of supplementary tables which contain more detailed offence classification data

by magistrates' courts and Crown Court and a further breakdown by police force area and petty sessional division.

Recorded crime

5.5 million notifiable offences were recorded by the police in 1993, a fall of 1 per cent or 61,000 over 1992

Firearms

In 1993, the police recorded 13,951 offences in which firearms were reported to have been used, an increase of 5 per cent over the previous year.

Homicide

In 1993 the most commonly recorded method of killing formale victims was a sharp instrument (35 per cent). Female victims were most likely to be killed by strangulation.

Those cautioned or found guilty

Drug offences had the highest cautioning rate amongst indictable offence groups, at 62 per cent.

Courtproceedings

The number of proceedings for indictable offences decreased by 2 per cent in 1993 to 479,000. However, without changes in recording practice in MPD there would have been a further fall of 2.5 per cent.

Sentencing

The number of 10-13 year olds sentenced in 1993 was similar to both 1991 and 1992.

Use of police bail and court remand

The proportion of persons failing to appear at court continued to increase in 1993, although part of this increase is likely to be due to improved recording.

Previous convictions: studies based on the Offenders Index

A third of males convicted of standard list offences in 1991 had no previous convictions for a standard list offence; a quarter had over 10 such previous convictions.

Criminal Appeals, England and Wales, 1993

This bulletin presents statistics of criminal appeals made in 1993 to the Crown Court against magistrates' sentences and to the Criminal Division of the Court of Appeal against sentances of the Crown Court. The tables in this bulletin are for the year in which the appeal decision was made (the original court decision as well as the application for leave to appeal may have been made in an earlier year) and are based on returns made directly to the Home Office from the courts.

The following main points are described:

- In 1993, there were 19,000 appeals heard by the Crown Court, an increase of around 3,000 over 1992. There were around 6,500 appeals made to the Court of Appeal in 1993.
- The number of appeals against conviction rose to over 11,200 at the Crown Court, and up to a little under 2,000 at the Court of Appeal, in 1993.
- The proportion of successful appeals against convictions at the Crown Court remained at 16 per cent in 1993, the same as in 1992.
- The 'rate of appeal' against magistrates' sentences rose to 1.0 per cent in 1993, up from 0.7 per cent in each of the last four years. The 'appeal rate' against sentences of the Crown Court rose one per cent in 1993 (up from 7 to 8 per cent).

Prison Population in 1994

The annual statistical bulletin providing summary information on the prison population in England and Wales was published on 27 April. The bulletin includes monthly data for 1994 by type of prisoner together with a breakdown of ethnic origin and sentenced offence groups for 30 June. The population figures include prisoners held in police cells. Information on those received into custody (as untried and as sentenced) is provided. Annual data for 1989 to 1994 is also given.

The average population in custody in 1994 was 48,800, 4,200 higher than in 1993 and the highest level since 1988. The higher prison population in 1994 continued the trend started in 1993 and followed a steep fall during 1992. Both the remandand sentenced populations rose rapidly in the first half of 1994, but the rate of increase slackened in the second half of the year. The rise reflected the increased use of custody for both remands and sentencing which occurred during 1993, partly reflecting the implementation of the Criminal Justice Act 1993 in August 1993.

Doctors' and Dentists' Remuneration

The Twenty-Fourth Report by the Review Body on Doctors' and Dentists' Remuneration (Chairman, CB Gough) was published in February 1995. The Report recommends on remuneration for the year beginning 1 April 1995 for doctors and dentists in the National Health Service.

Details of the recommendations for 1995-96 are in Appendix A of the Report. The Review Body recommended that salary levels for doctors and dentists in the Hospital and Community Health Service should rise by 2.5 per cent from 1 April 1995. For hospital consultants the Review Body also recommended an alternative system of 'transitional local pay' (if the parties are able to implement it by local agreement) which combines local flexibility within a centrally constrained pay framework. The Review Body recommended an increase of 3 per cent in General Medical Practitioners's intended average net remuneration and 2.5 per cent on the fees of General Dental Practitioners.

The Review Body published a Supplementary Report in April 1995 containing the feescale for General Medical Practitioners. This had been deferred while discussions continued between the Health Departments and the profession on a revised payments structure for out-of-hours arrangements.

The Twenty-Fourth Report by the Review Body on Armed Forces Pay (Chairman, Gordon Hourston) was published in February 1995. It shows recommended pay rates, together with recommended accommodation and food charges for Service ranks up to and including Brigadier (and equivalent), to apply from 1 April 1995.

Details of military salary (using Army ranks) are in Chapter 4 with special scales in Appendix 4. Additional pay and allowances are in Chapter 5 and Appendix 5 accommodation and food charges are shown in Chapter 6.

Seniorsalaries

The Review Body on Senior Salaries (Chaired by Lord Nickson) published its Seventeenth Report on Senior Salaries in February 1995. The Review Body makes recommendations on the salaries of around 2,200 people in judicial office, in the senior civil service and in the senior ranks in the armed forces.

All the Review Body's recommendations were accepted by the Government. They provide for an overall increase of 2.5 per cent from 1 April for most of the remit group. For Civil Service grades 2 and 3, the 2.5 per cent will be distributed as performance pay: individual rises will, therefore, vary.

The Report, for the first time, recommended a salary range for permanent secretaries. A Remuneration Committee which will include members of the Review Body and will be chaired by its new Chairman, Sir Michael Perry, will, in future, make recommendations on the salary of permanent secretaries within the discipline of a new appraisal process.

The Review Body announced its intention to undertake a fundamental review of the judicial salary structure with

a view to reporting in its 1997 Report and to commence, as soon as appropriate, a full job evaluation for the senior ranks in the armed forces.

The Reportalso includes the results from the latest of the OME's regular survey of the pre-appointment earnings of recently appointed judges.

In March 1995, the Review Body published a Review of the Parliamentary Pension Scheme, the first in what will be regular three yearly reviews of the scheme. The Report contained four recommendations. recommendations were accepted by the Government: that the death in service gratuity should be increased to three times the Member's annual salary; that the scheme should allow members to nominate individuals, institutions and trusts to receive the death in service gratuity; and that a formal disputes procedure should be established for the Scheme. The Government rejected the fourth recommendation that the existing accrual rate of fiftieths should be applied to all service for currently sitting MPs in respect of their future pension entitlement, with appropriate augmentation for those who have been making up the shortfall voluntarily.

Pay of Professions Allied to Medicine

The Twelfth Report on Professions Allied to Medicine by the Review Body for Nursing Staff, Midwives, Health Visitors and Professions Allied to Medicine (Chairman, Michael Bett) was published in February 1995. Recommended 1 April 1995 national pay levels for chiropodists/podiatrists, dieticians, occupational therapists, orthoptists, physiotherapists, radiographers, and related grades in the National Health Service (NHS) are shown in Appendix A (together with equivalent levels for 1 April 1994), but the Report also recommends local

negotiations which it expects will bring improvements totalling between 1° and 3 per cent in total in most Trusts and other units. Appendix B shows the number of staff by grade and profession and details of the paybill are shown in Appendix C.

Appendix D contains results from a man power survey of the professions and related grades employed in the NHS, carried out by the NHS Executive. Details are given of vacancies, leavers and joiners in Great Britain in the professions covered by the Review Body, together with a comparison with the results of the previous year's survey. The response rate varied by profession but inno case did less than 95 per cent of relevant units provide usable data. The sources of joiners and the destination/reason for leaving of leavers are analysed by profession; and details of vacancies are given by profession, and by grade, region/country and London weighting zone both in total and within each of the five largest professions.

Pay of Nursing Staff, Midwives and Health Visitors

The Twelfth Report on Nursing Staff, Midwives and Health Visitors by the Review Body for Nursing Staff, Midwives, Health Visitors and Professions Allied to Medicine (Chairman, Michael Bett) was published in February 1995. Recommended 1 April 1995 national pay levels for the National Health Service (NHS) are shown in Appendix A (together with equivalent levels for 1 April 1994), but the Reportalso recommends local negotiations which it expects will bring improvements totalling between 1° and 3 per cent in total in most Trusts and other units. Appendix B shows the number of staff by grade and profession and details of the paybill are shown in Appendix C.

Appendix D contains results of a survey of vacancies at 31 March 1994 among nursing staff employed in Trusts and directly managed units (DMUs) in the NHS in

Great Britain. 66 per cent of the 291 'first-, second-, and third-wave' Trusts and 74 per cent of the 355 DMUs provided usable information. Results are given by grade and by area of work, in total and within country, region and London weighting zone. A matched sample comparison with the results of the previous year's survey is also included.

The Fourth Report by the School Teachers' Review Body (Chairman, John Gardiner) was published in February 1995. Recommended levels of remuneration for the year from 1 April 1995 for teachers in maintained schools in England and Wales are set out in Appendix D (together with equivalent levels for 1 April 1994).

Appendix Econtains a range of statistics about teachers, including key results from two sample surveys carried out by the Review Body. One collected data on the working patterns of just under 4,000 teachers; and the second collected information from just over 1,800 schools on the distribution of teachers on their pay spines, and the use made of the pay flexibilities and discretions in the pay structure.
