- Session outline
- Session abstract (for inclusion in programme)
- Session format: Chair, presenter(s) name(s) and organisations; discussant(s);
  panellists
- Papers: If individual papers are part of your session, please list each paper title and authors. All full papers or extended abstracts in the special session must be submitted here: <a href="https://app.oxfordabstracts.com/stages/79596/submitter">https://app.oxfordabstracts.com/stages/79596/submitter</a>, selecting the special session option. If your proposal is unsuccessful, the paper submissions will be considered for the main programme.

For panel discussions, please indicate chair, speakers, and suggested topics of discussion.

#### **Guidelines on extended abstracts**

#### What is an extended abstract?

An extended abstract will contain the same information in a full paper, only in a shorter and more concise format. An extended abstract will contain references, comparisons to related work, any key equations and information that would be expected in a full paper.


The length of an extended abstract will be anywhere between 800 and 3000 words.

# What not to include:

- Future work
- Details of proofs or implementation that should seem plausible to reviewers
- Ramifications not relevant to the key ideas of the abstract
- Appendices
